

Saint Birgitta and the City of God (7,5 ECTS credits)

Level: 1st cycle

Discipline: THEOLOGY

Admission requirements

General admission requirements for university studies. Students taking part in the course as a part of their Bachelor's degree program must have completed Course A, Introduction in Philosophy and Theology (30 ECTS credits). Students taking part in the course as a freestanding course are expected to have corresponding prior knowledge.

Educational goals

After completing the course the students should:

- Be able to understand the notion of political theology, its origin and development within the Christian Middle Ages.
- Be familiar with Birgitta's political and social writings, and show general understanding of their historical and theological context.
- Be able to give an account of Augustine's *De Civitate Dei* and its place in the history of Christian political theology.
- Be able to reflect on the influence of Medieval political theology on contemporary Western political thought.

Course content

This course explores political theology of St. Birgitta of Sweden (1303–1373) as presented in her own writings, *The Revelations*, read in Swedish and English translation, consulting the original Latin version. Are Birgitta's political and social ideas still relevant for today's Christian communities? Or are they just a token of good old Middle Ages? As we progress with these questions, we direct our focus to one of Birgitta's sources of inspiration, Augustine's *City of God*.

Teaching and examination

The course is partly taught online via the Moodle platform, where there will be weekly reading assignments throughout the course. During the two in-person weekend sessions, lectures and discussions of the source texts will take place. Examination will take the form of a written assignment (around 10 pages) due on the last weekend of the course.
